Minutes

Roll Call Mayor Ann K. Leppanen, Luanne Hook, Brant Murray, Jim Sayers, Linda Sosa
Michael Haviken was also present

The meeting started at 8:01 a.m.

1. Discussion and Vote on San Juan County Roads Bid to Fill Potholes and Do Shoulder Work in and on Class C Roads in Bluff
2. Discussion and Vote on Hiring Michael Haviken on an 'As Needed' Contract to Work on Roads Issues, Including Signage 3.

Leppanen explained that Haviken has been working with numbers and measurements and he and Murray have discussed with Benny Musselman options for needed roadwork in Bluff. Musselman informed Leppanen that he can bring a crew and has the material needed for pothole repair October 1st. Haviken did a survey of potholes earlier in the year and counted 17. He and Murray will do a quick survey later today, before the crew gets here. Sayers motioned to name Haviken as working on behalf of the Town of Bluff with the County and UDOT for the duration of this project, projected at one day. Sosa seconded and Leppanen, Hook, Sayers, Murray, and Sosa voted in favor. Haviken reported the price we were given earlier in the year was less than \$3,000 and the current price is about \$6,000 but it is for more materials. The actual bill will cover the time and materials used. Sayers mentioned concern about the need for bike lanes and shoulder

repairs for bike safety. He will address these in our January meeting about pedestrian issues. He is willing to talk to Musselman about this issue because Musselman may have a road improvement project coming up. Because road materials are only available until mid-October, Leppanen suggested letting Jared Beard, UDOT District 4 engineer, know that it could affect his turn lane. After discussion Murray motioned to use up to \$32,000 for road repairs for this year. This includes potholes, grading, shoulder work, and chip and seal. Sayers seconded and Leppanen, Hook, Sayers, Murray, and Sosa voted in favor. Adjourned at 8:48 a.m.
