The Town of Bluff is eligible to apply for CDBG funding provided the Town of Bluff meets the applicable program requirements. The purpose of the public hearing is to provide citizens with pertinent information about the Community Development Block Grant program and to allow for discussion of possible applications. This public hearing will cover eligible activities, program requirements, and expected funding allocations in the region. The CDBG Program can fund a broad range of activities, including, but not limited to: construction of public works and facilities, e.g., water and sewer lines, fire stations, acquisition of real property, and provision of public services such as food banks or homeless shelters. In the event that the Town of Bluff chooses to apply for CDBG funding, a second public hearing will be held at a later time to discuss the project.
