Good morning Marcia,

You asked for the dimensions of the kiosks built for the Bluff River Trail. We had two timber frame kiosks built by Yestermorrow in 2023. They are currently disassembled and stored in a barn at Bill and Debbie's farm. The two kiosks have different dimensions. The smaller kiosk is roughly 7' 6" wide by 7' 8" high. The larger kiosk is roughly 9' 5" wide by 8' high. The actual signs protected by the kiosks are 3' wide by 5' high in the smaller kiosk and 4.5' wide by 5' wide in the larger kiosk. We, the Bluff River Trail committee, made a concerted effort to comply with the Sign Ordinance (2022). I have attached the plans and photo of one of the kiosks with the students who built them.

We had hoped to place the kiosks, pending approval from the Town Council, at trail-heads in east and west Bluff. We envisioned the smaller kiosk in the old bus parking area at the CCC. The original Sign Ordinance would have likely allowed that. The 2022 ordinance states: "The following signs are exempt from a sign permit as long as they meet the requirements below: Non-electric signs 40 square feet or less are exempt from a sign permit in all other zones." The new Draft Sign Ordinance is more restrictive. It says "signs are prohibited in public rights-of-way. Michael Haviken says that the road right-of-way along East Bluff streets is 99 ft. which means 49.5 ft. on either side of the road centerline. Debbie believes that the old bus parking area is within the ROW and not on school property. A kiosk in this ROW may be disallowed under a new Sign Ordinance.

We hope to place the second larger kiosk in West Park.

We appreciate the hard work you are doing at Planning and Zoning. If we can be of further help please let us know.
